Focal Passages: Luke 10:29-37

Focal Story: The Story of the Good Samaritan

Focal Question: Where do I get Living Water?

Generosity Description: Life with Jesus cheerfully gives back to God and others in abundance.

Bible Study Content Outline:

- 1. Generosity is an action without expectation of receiving anything in return.
- 2. Generosity is not limited to those we like. The victim was a Jew, despised by Samaritans.
- 3. Our Motivation for Generosity Gratitude for God's loving us and his grace.
- 4. 1 Cor. 13 describes Agape love and provides characteristics of Agape love.
- 5. Expressions of Generosity:
 - Time
 - Material Resources
 - Christ-like spirit
 - Faith
 - Relationship
 - Abilities and Talents
- 6. Discipline to grow the spiritual practice of generosity may lead us to:
 - a. Develop an understanding of generosity and what it means.
 - b. Develop regular practices and rhythms of generosity (inhale and exhale).
- 7. Generosity comes from the Spirit's power within us. Jesus, exhausted from a busy schedule, could still stop in the middle of chaos to generously share of his love, compassion, power, and self with the haemophiliac woman.

- What parts of generosity come naturally to me and where do I struggle with it? Why?
- What expressions of generosity discussed do I give away generosity and which ones do I do I hold back from sharing? Why?
