New Creation

- > John's vision of heaven is not the expected ending, but a fresh beginning.
- Creation draws to a close AND <u>begins</u> again.
- The sin-ruined creation of Genesis is restored in the sacrifice-renewed creation of Revelation.
- \succ Heavens and earth = everything.
- > All of our senses (earth) and beyond (heaven)
- Heaven and <u>earth</u> 2 poles of one material reality body and spirit.
- > Jesus prays God's will "on earth as it is in heaven."
- > Heaven is not Remote it is immediate.
- > Heaven is not something we wait for until we die.
- > Heaven IS now, just barely out of our range of senses.
- John's vision of heaven is not the promise of anything other than what we have already experience in faith.
- ➢ It does promise MORE.
- > The completion of today. The End of now and the beginning of what is next.
- Don't settle for less!
- > Too often we interpret heaven in terms of earth.
- > Let us interpret earth in terms of heaven.
- ➢ Heaven is not a fantasy.
- > John's vision throughout Revelation demonstrates we have access to heaven NOW.
- > The invisibility of God's realm today will be visible to us in the future.
- > In these passages John rewrites Genesis, Isaiah, Ezekiel and Jesus
- Confirming the promises made through centuries by people of <u>faith.</u>
- > The presence of God the realm of God's rule has invaded our world and our lives!
- > Thanks be to God. Amen.

The New Heaven

- > John's description of the <u>city (the People of God)</u> is meant to be symbolic.
- > City measure 1,500 miles in length, breadth, and height (21:6).
- New Jerusalem is a <u>Cube.</u>
- Cube = most perfect of geometric shapes.
- > Heavenly Jerusalem is splendid in harmony and symmetry of perfect proportions.
- Ancient cities streets aren't paved.
- > New Jerusalem paved with streets of **<u>Gold</u>**. Perfection
- No temple in this city because the immediate presence of the God is no longer a reserved place.
- > Place of living water and the **<u>Tree</u>** of Life giving nourishment and healing.

- > Now that creation as been redeemed it is safe to eat from the Tree of Life.
- To see God is not only to be in God's presence, it is to enjoy a intimate relationship of trust.

The Last Words

- We return to the <u>beginning</u>.
- > This book of vision is a revelation of Jesus, not the end of the world.
- > John forgets.
- ➢ He attempts to worship the angel − the messenger − and not Jesus.
- The book of Revelation tempts us to focus our attention of symbols, <u>charts</u>, end time scenarios.
- > Never forget, the book exists to proclaim **Jesus is** Lord.
- 2 Greek Words for Time:
- Chronos Chronological <u>time.</u>
- Kairos Pregnant Time
- > Too often we focus on Chronos when we reflect on End times.
- > Revelation calls our attention to **Kairos.**
- To focus on Kairos is to view the future as a source of expectation that pour energy into the present.
- We don't stop and wait for the future to come to us; we participate in God's future today as we live our lives faithfully for Jesus.
- > John changes the wording the future tense of "to be"
- > NOT who was and is and will.
- > Instead, The God who was, and is and is TO COME.
- ➢ God is a not a God of an unknown future.
- ➢ God is the ONE who PROMISES to return − to <u>come</u>.
- > Shift from metaphysics of time to history of salvation.
- ➢ God will Come!
- > So we speak the words with the prophet John and the churches of Asia Minor.
