The enterprise provides capital for small and medium sized businesses impacting refugee stability throughout the world. Dalton is also Co-Founder and former CEO of MainStreet Technologies, Inc. (MST), developers of software, as well as providers of advisory services for U.S. financial institutions specific to loan loss reserves and loan portfolio risk. MST was the financial industry's first to automate the required estimation of loan and lease losses with application software. Further, MST both developed and supported real estate management solutions for local government offices throughout the southeast. MST Government Records was acquired in 2017 by Kofile Technologies, Dallas, Texas. MST's financial technology software and advisory practice was acquired in 2018 by Accel-KKR, Menlo Park, California.

Although Dalton's first career may appear far-removed from technology and humanitarian assistance, his newspaper experience informed future endeavors. As a publisher, associate publisher, editor, and staff writing for Community Newspapers, Inc. (CNI) between 1987 and 1999, the publications were early adopters of technologies including pagination and digital photography. CNI's core philosophy of publishing "distinguished and profitable newspapers" influenced Dalton's philosophy on sustainable enterprises.

He is currently studying International Relations through Harvard University's Extension School, seeking a Master of Liberal Arts. Dalton graduated from Valdosta State University in 1986 with a Bachelor of Science in Sociology and Criminal Justice.
