Marcia and I have already started preparing our little transition apartment for Christmas! As I carried in our Christmas boxes from our storage unit, we began playing Christmas music to set the Christmas mood. Soon, we were adorning our new artificial tree with our Christmas ornaments. Like paging through a scrapbook of memories, each ornament carries a story.

The travel ornaments tell the story of our family adventures. With great joy, we place the Navajo sandstone ornament purchased on the road to the Grand Canyon. The dark green Jericho glass ornament brings us back to our pilgrimage to Israel this summer. The Seattle space needle ornament reminds us of our trips to the Pacific Northwest to visit my sister.

After the travel ornaments come the "Kid Creation" ornaments. Most of these pieces of paper, aluminum foil and clay were created by our girls as they grew up. There is no earthly value to these trinkets, but they are placed with care in the most prominent places on the tree. Like snapshots, these kid creation ornaments take us straight back to the moments in the church preschool when they were made and given to us with such excitement.

Finally, at the bottom of the ornament boxes, piled in heaps through all the moving this year, we find our childhood ornaments. These 1970's and 80's ornaments look cheap. These plastic Santas mixed with small wooden nativities and felt-covered reindeers find their way to the back of the Christmas tree. These ornaments carry some memories, but not too many. There are so many ornaments, we wait to the end to place them on the tree, often with frustration. Yet, our Christmas tree would not be our tree without them. So, we complete the job.

As we enter the Advent season together, there will be moments like the ornaments on our Christmas tree. Like the travel ornaments, some experiences will bring great joy as we plan, prepare, and work to make them just right. Like the "Kid Creation" ornaments, there will be experiences that have no earthly value, but we would not miss for the world. Finally, there will be experiences this Christmas that are hard work. We might puff and complain while we do them, but we know it would not be Christmas without them. So, we do.

As you balance the next month of events, parties, and family experiences, let me encourage you to include Jesus. Prioritize family and corporate worship experiences to remember the incarnational power at the heart of the Christmas story. First Baptist Church has been working to create some of these moments for you: we will have our Hanging of the Green service on Wednesday, December 4; our children and youth will lead us in a Christmas program in our 11:00 worship on December 8; our Sanctuary Choir will perform a beautiful Christmas cantata with a small orchestra on December 15; and finally, we will have a beautiful Candlelight Christmas Eve service with communion.

I hope to see you throughout the month of December. Please take time to share with me your favorite Christmas ornament stories and the events you have planned for the month. Next year, we look forward to inviting you into our new house to see the ornaments on our Christmas tree.
