## A Pastor Letter

Do you ever look around the world and think, "Is the world coming to an end?"

The world is pretty crazy these days, isn't it? We have the pandemic, the economic challenges, an election year, and — did you see this — the Asian Giant Hornets — aka the Murder Hornets — have arrived on US soil! Over the last couple of months, I have looked up from the news thinking, "I'm living through an apocalyptic movie."

Gratefully, the Bible speaks about end times. Some Christians throughout the centuries have read the Bible as a secret code book attempting to link God's plan to present events. This never works! Many wonderful people have been left staring at the sky as the world keeps on moving.

Rather than a secret code book telling us when the world will end, the Bible points us to God who is leading all things to a completion. The Greek word for "end" is *telos*. *Telos* also means completion or fulfillment. The world is not just moving to an end, it is moving to a completion.

Our lives matter because there will be an end. We will die. There will be a conclusion to our story. The Bible invites us to ask, "how will our lives matter in the end? How will lives be fulfilled?" With the end in mind, we live our lives differently. We pay attention to God's work in our lives. We slow down and enjoy our children or grandchildren more. We call on our friends. We live ethically in our business practices.

The pandemic has assisted us in paying attention to end things. And I have seen us start living new lives because of it.

In June, I will preach a sermon series called **The End is Near: Lessons from the Minor Prophets**. While we will briefly focus on the idea of end things, we will primarily examine things that must end in order to live authentic, abundant Jesus lives in our world.

Then, in July, we will begin our first in-person gatherings with the Wednesday Night Live Bible Study in the Sanctuary. I will be teaching on the Book of Revelation. It will be a fun, exciting story. I hope you will join us in person or through live stream.

Your life matters - to God, to me and to our church. I'm grateful for you. I look forward to a fun summer together.

## Words of Wisdom

"And in this day...while great are the numbers of online research, medical expertise, authority edicts, hopeful suggestions and personal opinions regarding the health of the world's inhabitants...our daily, family and community trust remains in the Lord whose name is Eternal as are His promises."

-paraphrase from the Post-Testamental writings - Questatations 1:1

Anyone else feeling the confusions of the first part of my statement above? I would imagine that each of us is deep into discerning what we are comfortable or confident in doing to deal with Covid-19. But, I would also believe that we are even more confident of God's sovereignty in His world and His desire for us to be assured of His love and mercy for each of us during these days.

Pastor Eric is leading us thoughtfully, courageously, and compassionately while looking ahead at various possibilities for the future - and the staff and church council is discussing it regularly. I have shared with Eric the pervasive response from the musical world that I have connected with over the last couple of months (including 2 online conferences sponsored by the National Association of Teachers of Singing and the American Choral Director's Association). The health and safety issues regarding musical group rehearsal/performance, choral singing, wind instrument performance and congregational singing require extreme caution. This is due to, primarily, to the fact musical performance, especially choral music, projects more aerosols that normal speaking or solo singing which can be more isolated.

Church musicians around the country are currently attempting to determine what can be done now or in a progressive timeframe. There is still more data needed before a vaccine to determine what and when choirs and orchestras can do what they most want: offer their music to the Lord, each other and their community.

So, for now, you might consider...

- Read the Psalms inscribed to the Chief Musician, a Psalm of Asaph or some of the Psalms of David
- Hum in the morning to 'explore' your voice as it awakens; buzz your lips and have some fun with lip trills.
- Lightly sing a hymn, chorus or favorite song as your day progresses then, as the voice feels healthy and strong...let it fly!
- Listen to inspiring music vocal, choral, orchestral and contemporary Christian...in addition to your favorite genre
- Feel free to commiserate and console other musicians who are experiencing the same thoughts and emotions pray with them and for them and the struggles within their organization or church.

"Let the word of Christ dwell richly in you with all wisdom, teaching and instructing each other in psalms, hymns and spiritual songs singing to God with thankfulness in your hearts." —Colossians 3:16

Finally, here is a performance of "Sweet Are the Prayers of a Friend" by Pepper Choplin and performed by singers from Second Presbyterian Church in Memphis, TN and conducted by Calvin Ellis, organist-choirmaster - that shows their selective courage in providing this anthem for their congregation.
